

LIVING AND VISITING IN THE VILLAGE

10-83 – Operation of Motor Vehicles within the Village

- This bylaw established rules governing the operation of vehicles on the public roads within the village.
- The bylaw speaks to the speed limit, tire noise, excessive acceleration, and the establishment of “yield” intersections. The bylaw also forbids the obstruction of driveway entrances, “power turns”, erection of signs, or defacing of existing signs.

02-85 – Incorporating the Motor Vehicle Act

- This bylaw incorporates the Saskatchewan Motor Vehicles Act and amendments within the Resort Village.

07-84 – Dogs Running at Large (04-07 – Amendment - sets fine)

- This bylaw established that dogs shall not be allowed to run at large in the Village. The fine is \$200.

04-86 – Noise Bylaw

- This bylaw generally prohibits unnecessary or unusual noise that annoys, disturbs, injures, endangers or detracts from the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of other persons within the limits of the Village. The bylaw also specifies that:
- Lawn mowers, snow blowers, model aircraft are not to be operated between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on weekdays (9:00 a.m. on holidays and Sundays).
- Construction noises shall be limited to the hours from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. on all days.
- Diesel engines shall not be allowed to run while sitting stationary for longer than 20 minutes.
- Dogs shall not be allowed to bark or howl excessively.
- No person shall play radios, televisions, tape recorders, or amplifiers such that it can be easily heard by a member of the public not on the same premises.
- The penalty for contravening this bylaw is a minimum of \$50 and a maximum of \$500.

03-01 – Abandoned Vehicles

- This bylaw defines an abandoned vehicle as one that has been left on a street or public place for 10 days or more and for which the owner cannot be ascertained. The bylaw authorizes Council to remove, sell, destroy or otherwise dispose of such vehicles.

05-05 – Nuisances Bylaw

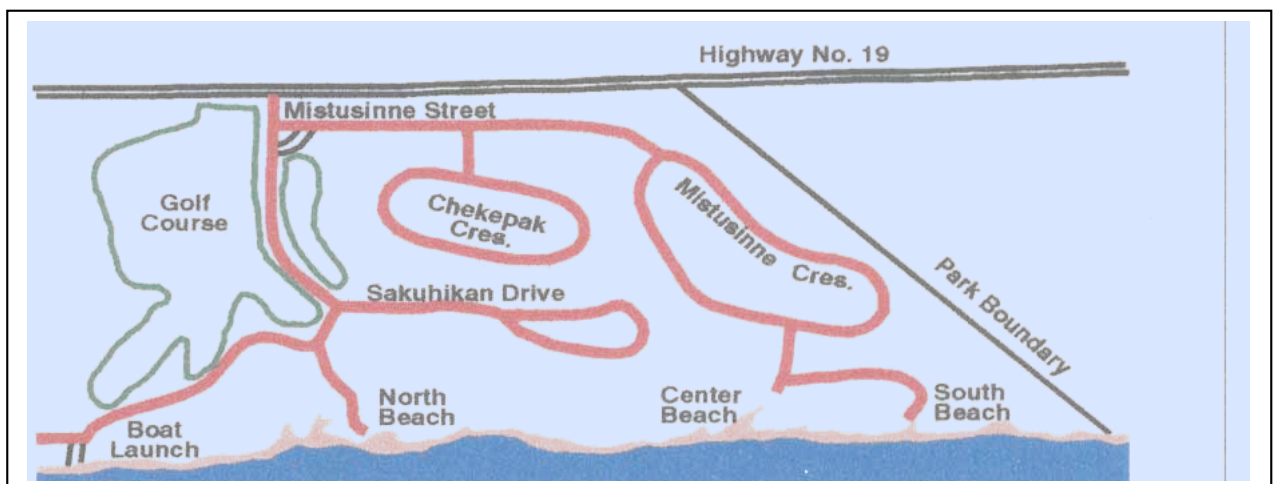
- This bylaw deals with property, activities, or things that adversely affect the safety, health or welfare of people in the neighbourhood, people’s use

and enjoyment of their property, or the amenity of the neighbourhood. For example, nuisances can include:

- Junked vehicles in a partly dismantled or inoperative condition.
 - Dilapidated buildings that are dangerous to the public or that are substantially detrimental to the amenities of the neighbourhood.
 - Overgrown grass or weeds (in excess of 20 centimetres or 8 inches).
 - Open excavations.
 - Refrigerators or freezers stored outdoors.
 - Dead or hazardous trees, sharp or dangerous objects.
 - Improperly stacked lumber or firewood that could harbour rodents, etc.
- The bylaw allows for inspections by a Designated Officer and the issuance of an Order to Remedy. It also allows the Village to recover any costs incurred by the Village in remedying a contravention or the imposition of penalties under Bylaw 02-82.
 - Exhibits to this bylaw include Orders to Remedy, a set of 5 letters directing the property owner to remedy a nuisance involving a building or structural condition, a derelict or junked vehicle or trailer, an excavation, an unspecified nuisance, or an untidy or unsightly premises. Other exhibits include a notice of violation, an order for the owner to take emergency action, and an emergency action taken by the Village.

02-07 – Non-Licensed Motorized Vehicles & Motorcycles (11-07, 03-07 – Amendments, map & fines)

- The bylaw states that licensed motorcycles and all terrain vehicles:
 - Shall only be permitted to travel on paved or main access roads as defined on the following map:



- Will not be allowed in roadway ditches or on green spaces (public land) except for the area north of the golf course and south of the railway track.
- Will not be allowed on the beach south of the boat launch to the boundary of Douglas Provincial Park from April 1st to October 31st, unless delivering a handicapped person to the beach (and then must return to park at the beach parking area).
- Are permitted on the beach during snow season to facilitate ice fishing.
- The bylaw also requires that persons operating a licensed motorcycles or an all terrain vehicle must:
 - Not create any nuisance or undue annoyance to residents.
 - Not create a danger to other persons or property.
 - Wear a helmet in the prescribed manner.
 - Be sixteen years of age, or if between the ages of 12 and 15 inclusively, be accompanied by an adult rider or directly supervised by an adult with a valid drivers license.
 - Not operate that vehicle at night without prescribed lights.
- Fines under this bylaw is \$250 for the first offense and \$500 for a subsequent offense.

07-07 – New Speed Bylaw

- This bylaw sets the speed limit in the village at 40 km/hr, except for the playground area between 449 and 450 Mistusinne and between 645 and 626 Sakuhikan Drive where the speed limit is set at 30 km/hr.
- The fine for offenses under this bylaw is \$100

09-08 – Boat Launch

- Vehicles shall park only in designated areas at the boat launch.
- Only boat trailers with valid permit stickers from the Resort Village will be allowed to park in the boat launch parking area.
- There shall be no swimming, fishing or use of the beach between two lines, each parallel to the boat launch and one of which is 100 feet south and the other 100 feet north of the boat launch, up to a limit of 100 feet into the water from the water's edge (including the boat dock).
- A person found guilty of an infraction of any provision of this bylaw shall be liable to a fine of \$100.

09-07 – Beach Area and Users

This bylaw addresses the beach area south of the boat launch to the boundary of Douglas Provincial Park, requiring that:

- There be no vehicles on the beach from **October 1st** to **April 31st** . Fine - \$250
- There be no open fires on the beach. Fine #100
- There be no littering on the beach. Fine - \$100

- Dogs be on a leash and restrained from bothering other beach users. Fine - \$200

13-07 – Snowmobile Bylaw

- Snowmobiles shall be permitted to operate within the Resort Village subject to the following conditions:
 - All travel is to be on roadway ditches, beaches and the leased area north of the golf course.
 - No travel will be allowed on Resort Village leased green spaces (public land) with the exception of the leased area north of the golf course.
 - No person shall operate a snowmobile within the Resort Village in such a manner as to create a nuisance or undue annoyance to residents or other persons within the Resort Village.
 - No person shall operate a snowmobile upon any property in such a manner that is dangerous to other persons or property.

Fine of \$250 per occasion.
