Council Meeting Highlights

February 22, 2026, meeting.

Council approved the minutes of the January 18th, 2026, regular meeting of council. These are available on our website. The next regular meeting will be held on Sunday, March 22, at 12:00 p.m. at the Municipal Office. Council members may choose to attend electronically, weather dependent.

There were no delegates to the meeting.

Edward Stenko presented his verbal report. The tractor was in for repairs. There were discussions around the Boat Launch, and our options for repairing the concrete. Operations will reach out to contractors for further conversation. Options will be presented to council this month.

Council continues to work on a First Responders agreement.

The Village of Elbow provided an update on the proposed Fire Protection Service Agreement. Numbers have yet to be finalized. Council has expressed concerns with the formula proposed to determine billing. Administration will reach out to other Resort Villages to determine how similar communities are addressing this scenario. There will now be a call out fee billed to the property owner along with the hourly charges for service. Please ensure you have adequate Fire Insurance to cover these charges.

Council has completed a first reading of our updated Civic Addressing Bylaw. Bylaw No. 03-2026. This Bylaw outlines the requirements for displaying addresses on residences. The Village has officially completed the Civic Addressing requirements as outlined by the province. Please ensure your house number is displayed accordingly. The Bylaw will be made available on our website once the Bylaw has been passed.

Our Lagoon agreement with the Village of Elbow remains in place until 2028. Elbow has advised that the cost of lagoon access will increase if, and when the contract is renewed. Further discussions are required by council.

Mayor Lloyd Montgomery, and Administrator Dodd will be attending the annual SUMA Convention in Regina from April 12 – 15.

As per the annual rate payer survey, the beaches will be named as follows:

Beach 1 – North Beach

Beach 2 – Boat Launch Beach

Beach 5 – South Beach

Beach #3 and #Beach 4 are not as clear cut. Council is considering naming beach #3 High Water Beach and Beach # 4 Mistusinne Beach. Does anyone have any suggestions, feedback, comments, concerns?

Now that civic addressing has been completed, council has authorized a new Municipal Map. It should take about 4-6 weeks for the new maps to become available. We will have maps available in the office once the project has been completed.

There were no building permits for this meeting. The building permit system is in the process of being overhauled. Please stay tuned for more information.

Council will be hosting a Tree Cutting and Planting Day on Sunday, May 31. Council is looking for parties who would willing to donate funds to help pay for said trees. Donation receipts can be provided. Administration has applied for

grants and will continue to do so. Council authorized administration to apply for both a MuniSoft Community Project Grant, and a SUMAssure Community Sponsorship program grant to assist with the purchasing of trees. We were successful with the SUMAssure Grant. Two others have now been applied for.

Councilor Coutts is looking for entertainers for our August long entertainment.

Council reviewed the January Financials. Accounts payable to date were approved. Correspondence from: Line 19 Health Care Committee – Clinic Proposal, SUMAssure Funding Awarded, SAMA AGM Invite 2026, SK Lotteries Funding Follow – Up, Enbridge Updates Q1 2026, Provincial Crack Sealing 2026 Correspondence, and Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency – PDAP Training Invitation was reviewed.
